1. **ACTIVITIES REFLECTING THE GOALS AND OBJECTIVES OF THE INSTITUTION:**

2. NEW ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES INITIATED (UG AND PG):

In the academic session 2008-09 the college initiated a new self financed programme of B.P.Ed.

Purpose of Opening B.P.Ed. Course

The role of Bankura Christian College in the academic field had been immense since the time of its inception. Students in Bankura and its surroundings had realized their dreams in the academic field by being a part of this college. However, it was also seen that many people in this district had a natural inclination towards sports and games as many of the people in this region belong to the tribal clans. Considering this aspect, the college authorities decided to launch a new course which can harness this natural ability into a productive output. This new course aims to enlighten the students by exposing their capability in the field of games and sports. Simultaneously it will also endeavour to produce efficient teachers for the school children promoting their physical and mental fitness

Duration: The course consists of one academic year comprising not less than two hundred days. Every year the academic session starts simultaneously with other Under Graduate curricula in the month of July. The Governing Body of the college has fixed the course fee of B.P.Ed at Rs. 40,000 per annum.

The feedback was taken on 5th February, 2009; 42 students of the English Department participated in the process. Their overall response pertaining to the various categories given in the feedback form affirms the committed role played by the faculty members. However, it was found that some students felt teachers did not frequently ask questions in the classroom. The faculty resolved in the departmental meeting that in future they would endeavour to make the classes more interactive. The students' opinions were sought with regard to the following:

- (ii) The teacher's regularity in taking the classes
- (iii) Ability to systematically teach a topic
- (iv) Style of delivery
- (v) Personality
- (vi) Ability to create interest in topics taught
- (vii) Whether encouraging the students to ask questions
- (viii) Eagerness to help outside the classroom
- (ix) Overall assessment of the teaching

28. COMPUTER AND INTERNET ACCESS AND TRAINING TO TEACHERS AND STUDENTS:

Since the establishment of Bankura Christian College, the institution has undertaken a leading role in the emancipation of the local people in Bankura and the adjoining districts. Besides, providing a congenial atmosphere for the students in pursuing their academic goals, the college has also shown an unfailing interest in the extra-academic matters relating to the effective fulfillment of the cherished desires of the students. In this modern globalized era, where information technology has taken a big leap, students in other parts of this nation are endeavouring to explore the possibilities of faster access to information. With regards to this notion, the UGC communicated to Bankura Christian College vide letter no. F.11-1/87 (Comp / Policy File) dated 12/06/04, to place a demand for Network Resource in the college. In reply to the letter of UGC, the college sent its proposal to UGC vide letter no. F/28(C)/ BCC/04/167 dated 26/06/04 requesting to release a grant for the purpose. The students strength at the time of placing the proposal to UGC was 1264 and 569 in Arts and Science streams respectively whereas there were 71 PG students. In 2004, we had 4 computers and 56 teachers in the college. However, unfortunately, we did not receive a favourable response from UGC.

The scenario today has largely changed as the number of students in the Arts stream has crept up considerably along with an increase in the number of faculties. Present records display the fact that now we have almost 1800 students in Arts, whereas, the number in the case of science stream has remained almost constant over the years. The total number of PG students has doubled to 150. As a matter of fact, the college has been able to provide computers to all the departments in Science stream and this has become possible because all the departments in the Science stream have their individual departments. In contrast, the Arts departments are too many and due to lack of space, the college has been unable to provide dedicated internet facilities to all the specific departments in Arts stream. Our record also shows that on an average a student is engaged in active internet access for approximately 2 hrs a day; which is meagre when we take into account the total number of students in the college and the only two computers (other than the specific departmental computers) which the general students can use. The number of teaching faculties has also increased over the years, as we now have around 75 teachers in both the Arts and Science streams. The crisis gets reflected in the general staff room where there are only three computers for 75 teachers. Based on these statistics, we therefore claim for an aid from UGC which, then, can help us to enrich the mode of teaching in the Arts stream along with providing the students of all the departments with their respective departmental computers. Students will be highly benefited when they will get free internet facility in the college instead of paying @ Rs. 20 / hour in cyber cafes outside the campus. The college is also currently providing high-speed internet (Broadband facility) which no other internet cyber cafes provide. With the proposed aid, we are looking forward to extend this free and high-speed internet facility to the teachers and students alike. This proposed aid is therefore a necessity which must be considered by the respective authorities, keeping in mind the locale of the college and the tenacity of the authorities to provide faster information at free cost.
