The most of the habitants are Christian by religion constituting around 80 houses. The conditions of road, school-ground, play ground etc. were very dirty and congested. So we chose that place for our NSS Unit-II special camp to beautify that region. This is a camp where the pending work which could not be finished in the usual time was finished through different types of activities. The theme of special camp this year was “HEALTHY YOUTH FOR HEALTHY INDIA”. The camp helped in creating durable community assets and improved the conditions of weaker sections of the area Christiandanga. The student volunteers participated in the special campaigning programme enthusiastically, understanding the dignity of labour and the need for combining physical work with intellectual pursuits.
