REPORT OF DAILY WORK DURING SPECIAL CAMP OF NSS
(DATED 27.12.10--03.01.11)
PLACE—SANABANDH (West)

Sanabandh west located towards west of Bankura is a slam area which comes under Nam-Anchuri gram panchayet area. The most of the habitants are Hindu by religion constituting around 100 houses. The conditions of road, school-ground, play ground etc. were very dirty and congested. So we choose that place for our NSS Unit-II special camp to beautify that region. This is a camp where the pending work which could not be finished in the usual time is finished through different types of activities. The camp helped in creating durable community assets and improved the conditions of weaker sections of the area Sanabandh. The student volunteers participated the special campaigning programme enthusiastically understanding the dignity of labor and the need for combining physical work with intellectual pursuits. The series of work which were undertaken during the 7 days special campaigning programme are listed below.

26. INCREASE IN THE INFRASTRUCTURAL FACILITIES:

After generating sufficient fund, the college decided to start the 2nd phase of the project that is complete of one half of the building of ground floor of the Wesleyan Block for Post Graduate Studies and Research with an average area of 6032 sq. ft. The total expenditure incurred in this process was Rs. 28,42,180/-. Work is still continuing and the PG department of English has already shifted to the new venue and Bengali is expected to be shifted soon. The 1st floor of the Wesleyan Block is to be completed next and the Central Library will be shifted there.

The Women's Hostel (funded by UGC) has been completed students have taken up residence. The construction of 1st floor of the Hostel is to begin soon.
